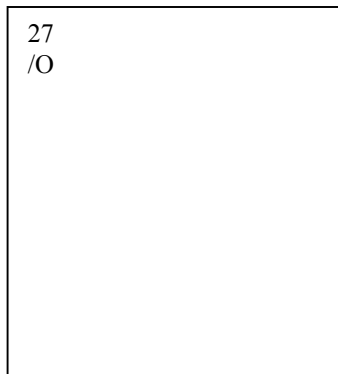
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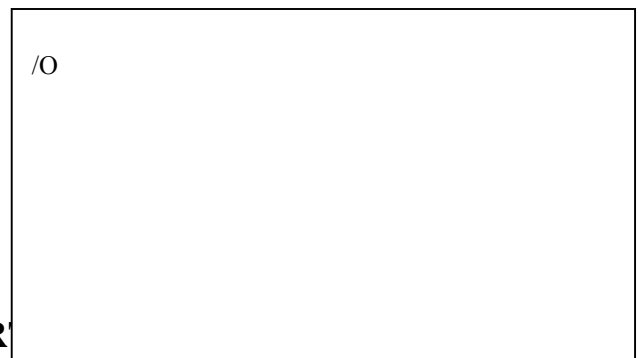

I have been an aquarium hobbyist/professional for over 35 years. MASI Show Rules for 2004

Gary Lange

Entry:

Open to all with payment of entry fees. Junior entrants are encouraged. Multiple entries per tank allowed as long as they are compatible and easily distinguishable by the judges (i.e. male/female, color variants, different species, etc.). Plant entries are allowed with fish entries in the same tank. All entries are eligible for Class 1, Aquascaping, without additional fee.

As a matter of ethics, entry must be the property of the entrant for at least 60 days before Show and/or must be work of Entrant. No hybrids, deformed, diseased, artificially colored (painted, dyed, or injected) or illegal fish may be shown.

Display:

All fish are to be entered in flat-sided bowls or tanks a minimum of _ gallon or larger up to 30 gallons (for larger tanks, entrant must provide their own proper aquarium stand). All entries are to be **covered with an appropriate cover and lighted. Sides and back of the display must be covered** with an opaque covering (i.e. paint, contact paper, or commercial background), and gravel or sand must be used on the bottom. Live plants are encouraged. Filtration and aeration are optional, but strongly recommended for the health of the entry. Air and electrical outlets will be supplied. Guppies, Killies, and *Betta splendens* may all be entered singly or in pairs in covered bare bowls or tanks of _ to 1 gallon in size. Naturalistic artificial decorations are allowed in all entries, and a flowerpot or PVC pipe may be used if needed for the comfort of the fish. For Class #18 – Photography – For video/electronic media, entrants must supply resources for viewing their entry. Single picture entries must be printed for viewing.

Judging:

All entries will be sight judged based on appropriate standards for the fish being judged.

Decision of Judges and/or Show Chairman is final. Show Chairman may move entries to appropriate classes if entered in wrong class or if there are too few entries in class.

Awards:

First, Second and Third place in each Class; Best Junior Entry; Reet Thomas Outstanding Livebearer Award; Ralph Wilhelm Outstanding Catfish Award; Best Egglayer; Judges Award for the most Outstanding Entry; and Best Fish in Show.

Tanks will be filled with treated St Louis water. Exhibitors may bring their own water if desired.

There will be a seminar Saturday afternoon entitled "Killifish - Their Care and Maintenance" featuring Dr. Charles Harrison on water quality in the fish room, Dr. Nevin Aspinwall on genera and species of killifishes, and Jack Heller on breeding and raising killifish, live food maintenance and fish room management techniques. We will have hands-on demonstrations in making a spawning mop, picking eggs and hatching peat-spawning killifish. We will also have raffles during the talk for the fish and eggs used in the presentation.

Benching will be allowed until noon on Saturday, and judging will be at 5 pm on Saturday afternoon.

There will be a silent auction for killifish on Sunday, concurrent with the MASI general auction, which will start on Sunday at 12 noon.

MASI HAP Year End Report for 2003

Well everyone, another year is a wrap, and the HAP is still going strong! This past year we had 109 submissions from 14 members, including 19 new species, and two new participants. 2003 also saw the return to the program of several members who have not been active for many years. Welcome back!

Several members are getting close to the next level in the program, and a few have moved up in the rankings. We also saw the first member to cross the 2000 point plateau, and several crossed the 1000-point plateau. Congratulations to all.

Changes in the program are coming for 2004. The new rules for the program should be in place by the time you read this, as should the new point values and the new award levels and requirements. All will be published here in the Darter, as well as updated on the website. The new rules are really just better definitions of existing rules to answer questions that seem to crop up year after year. New point values better reflect the ease or difficulty of propagating various plant species, either indoors or out. As in the BAP when we updated the point structure, no one will loose points or awards due to changes in the point structure, but mathematical and clerical mistakes from the old handwritten system will be corrected. Anyone whose point total would be moved downward due to the changes will receive a one time "grandfather" adjustment to keep their totals the same. As I look at the totals right now, no one will be loosing points due to the changes, though at least one person will be loosing a few points due to my mathematical error a few years ago. I apologize for that!

New levels and requirements for reaching those levels are meant to challenge the members who have reached the former highest plateau of "Grand Master Aquatic Horticulturist", which should allow them to continue competing with each other and challenging their Aquatic Green Thumb for years to come. As always, feel free to contact me with any program or plant related questions and I'll do my best to answer you or direct you to someone where you can get an answer.

Updates to the MASI HAP Rules for 2004

Non-indigenous Invasive Aquatic Plant Species

As most of you know, a few of the aquatic plant species that we as hobbyists have used for years have become established in places where they should not be; namely, various bodies of water here in the USA. Sometimes these introductions were intentional, other times accidental. Either way, though, the damage has been the same. Native species have been displaced, or even eliminated. Valuable Wetland habitat has been damaged or destroyed, which affects the fishes that we all love, as well as the quality of life for all of us.

Therefore, in order to keep up with the new regulations, we have modified the HAP rules to do our own small part in helping to control these species. I would suggest that we also ban them from club auctions. If anyone spots these plants in someone's tanks, they might mention to them that these plants might be invasive if they accidentally get into natural bodies of water. Most of them cannot survive winter temperatures, so they have not been banned nationally, but many States do ban them from within their borders. To be on the safe side, I would suggest NOT selling or distributing these plants, or, even better, getting rid of them altogether. The only safe way for hobbyists to dispose of them is to dry them out and burn them. NEVER FLUSH THEM DOWN THE DRAIN! Composting is not a safe alternative.

As of 9/8/2000, the last time I can find that the law and list were updated, Federal law bans INTERSTATE sale, distribution, or transportation of the plants on the list. Banning possession appears to be left up to the individual States, as their situation warrants. Various State laws ban possession, as well. As of September of 2003, Missouri bans only one aquatic plant species outright: Purple Loosestrife, *Lythrum salicaria*. The law prohibits the sale, distribution, transportation, or POSSESSION, of Purple Loosestrife; including it's roots, stems, leaves, flowers, fruits or seeds. If you spot this plant in the wild, report it to the Missouri Department of Agriculture as soon as possible. They have set up a Task Force to eradicate this plant.

There are only a few species on the list. With the many hundreds of species of beautiful aquatic plants available that are NOT harmful, invasive or in any way damaging to the environment, why even think of using these few species that are? Be responsible with all plants, and fish, for that matter, and dispose of them properly. Don't just flush your problem down the drain. It might come back to haunt us all!

...keep 'em green....

Here are the updates to the HAP rules:

“No plant species deemed a non-indigenous invasive or nuisance species, or a noxious weed by the State of Missouri Department of Agriculture or the U.S. Department of Agriculture will be allowed for submission. Any entrant submitting such species *BEFORE* the plant is placed on such list will not have points earned or credit for propagation taken away, but no further submissions will be accepted. Refer to list of prohibited species later in this document for any questionable species.”

In addition, I have added the current list of species to the end of the HAP Rules. This list is not meant to be all-inclusive, it is what was current at the time of writing. I will update the list as new information becomes available.

Prohibited Species List:

Certain plant species have not only become established in the wild, but have actually done so well that they are now considered a noxious weed or a nuisance species. Local, State, and Federal Government agencies spend many millions of dollars every year trying to control them. No responsible hobbyist should ever keep, sell or otherwise distribute, or discard any of these species in the wild or even down the drain. In fact, interstate distribution or sale and/or interstate transport of these species is illegal. Responsible hobbyists should destroy all plants on this list by drying and burning. Composting is not an acceptable way to dispose of these plants. The species below are on the Federal list. Currently,

as of the end of 2003, the State of Missouri Department of Agriculture only lists Purple Loosestrife, *Lythrum salicaria*, as a prohibited Aquatic Species. Possession, sale or any other type of distribution of Purple Loosestrife without a special permit issued by the Missouri Department of Agriculture is prohibited.

Seeing Red

Article Review by Terry Atherton

I will dedicate the article for this issue of Darter from "Aquatic Gardener" from the September 03 issue of Tropical Fish Hobbyist. Richard Sexton is the author, and the name of his writing for this month is "Seeing Red" concerning the effect of color of aquarium plants on the color of fish. The color in focus here is RED. Richard states that although plant pigment has a lot to do with it, there are other factors in relation to color prevalence. LIGHTING is the first one. Bright lights will make red plants redder, more so that red or blue lights over the aquaria. Red plants reflect red lights back, not absorbing it. Then, NUTRIENTS. Iron is essential in making a redder plant, using bottled liquid iron. It is possible to set up a whole aquarium of just red plants; among them he lists are *ammania*, a large bunch plant. *alternanthera*, a "scarlet hygro", others are pinkish-brown, then crimson-magenta. Then there are *rotala*, *vallisneria*, and *barclaya*. There is indeed a wide choice here for the aquarist to pick in decorating his or her tank, provided nearby pet shops have them available. I myself have turned a reflector light on my fish and have gotten such pleasure out of them flitting around the green water, but adding ornaments that don't have to be cared for makes my task easier. The ornaments can be varied and colorful too. This was a brief but fine article.

Service and Show Awards

Does anyone want to be the Show Champion next year? One of the requirements is to enter 5 monthly bowl shows. So, as well as grooming your entries for the annual show, consider bringing in entries to the bowl shows. You could end up with the most annual show wins and super bowl wins your category (novice or hobbyist), but miss out on the champion award - don't let this happen. The Novice of the Year and Hobbyist of the Year also could use some renewed attention. Points are awarded for club participation and various services to the club. The various committee chairs are supposed to report the points to the Points Tabulator to determine the award recipients. One way to gain points is to publish an original article in the Darter, hint, hint. Anyway, it is the start of a new year, and I'd like to see more friendly competition, which means collecting the points so they can be included. We need all the officers and committee chairs to be active in submitting the points, so the tabulator can provide updates, so we can announce the standings and encourage participation. Rules for both the Novice and Hobbyist of the Year and Novice and Hobbyist Show Champions are on the following two pages.

NOVICE OF THE YEAR and HOBBYIST OF THE YEAR

Each year the Missouri Aquarium Society, Inc. recognizes the outstanding contributions of those members performing services for the society. during the calendar year (Jan. 1 thru Dec. 31), points are awarded for service and involvement in the activities of the society. In January of each year, *Novice of the Year Award* and *Hobbyist of the Year Award* are presented to the members accumulating the most points during the preceding year. the minimum following requirements must be satisfied to qualify for these awards:

1. A minimum of eight (8) points must be earned for attendance at the general meetings.
2. You must enter the Annual Show.
3. A minimum of ten (10) points must be earned for service to the society other than listed above. These points do NOT include any meeting attendance points earned.

Service points will be awarded to individuals only (Mr. Smith, Mrs. Smith, Child Smith, etc.) and NOT to families (Mr. and Mrs. Doe, Doe Family, etc.)

POINTS SYSTEM FOR SHOW CHAMPIONS

NOVICE SHOW CHAMPION and HOBBYIST SHOW CHAMPION

The society offers friendly competition and the chance to display your fish in the form of an Annual Show, a Super Bowl Show and monthly bowl shows. Points are awarded for entering these competitions and for placing 1st., 2nd., or 3rd. At the end of each calendar year the points are tabulated and awards are presented to the novice and hobbyist members who have earned the most show points during that year. the minimum eligibility requirements to qualify for these awards are as follows:

1. You must enter the Annual Show.
2. You must enter Super bowl.
3. You must enter at least five (5) monthly bowl shows.
(This does not include super Bowl.)

Show points will be awarded either to an individual or family unit, as indicated by the entrant(s) at the time of their first showing. However, it will be the entrant(s) responsibility to continue to enter under the same name(s) throughout the rest of the year.
